I'm again reaching out to you in support of rezoning the church at 5136 N. Michigan Road for use by the Girls in STEM Academy. As a Washington Township resident and former high school chemistry teacher, I'm disappointed that Washington Township School is trying to deny deserving young women of color this life-changing educational opportunity.

STEM jobs are <u>projected</u> to grow by a percentage that's nearly double that of other jobs over the next decade. Because of the demand for these skills, those with STEM backgrounds <u>earn</u> on average about 66% more than those in non-STEM fields. Central Indiana has established itself as a hub for biosciences, with many employers that need workers who have STEM skills and experience. By cultivating the next generation of young women with a grounding in STEM, we're building a pipeline of homegrown talent to support our local economy.

I'm especially excited about the school's focus on serving students of color and those from low-income households, and it's encouraging that the school operator, Paramount Schools of Excellence, has a strong track record of success in this regard.

As a former educator, I'm deeply troubled by the number of students in our local schools who cannot demonstrate proficiency on the minimum standards ILEARN testing. The test results are particularly poor for our diverse students in Washington Township. How in the world do we expect these young people to lead productive and happy lives if they do not leave school with even the most basic skills?

Thanks for your efforts to ensure the future success of Girls in STEM Academy and those deserving young women who will attend.

Ms. Iraheta:

My name is James Betley and I am the Executive Director of the Indiana Charter School Board ("ICSB"), a statewide authorizer of charter schools created by the Indiana General Assembly. It has come to my attention that certain remarks that I made last year in an interview with the news organization Chalkbeat have been taken out of context by MSD Washington Township in a zoning matter involving the Girls in STEM Academy and Paramount Schools of Excellence (2023-ZON-109 at 5136 Michigan Road). While I understand that the Metropolitan Development Commission is primarily focused on the impact zoning petitions have on overall City planning considerations, I cannot let MSD Washington Township continue to misrepresent my statements.

MSD Washington Township has claimed, both in their presentation to the hearing examiner on February 26th and in subsequent emails, that my remarks are evidence that the ICSB believes that the City of Indianapolis is saturated with charter schools and therefore additional new charter schools are not needed in the city. This claim is inaccurate. Taken in context, my remarks were specifically addressing authorizing practices for charter school proposing to locate within *Indianapolis Public Schools* and not the City of Indianapolis as a whole. When I first learned of the misinterpretation, I reached out to Chalkbeat and asked that they print a clarification; however, while the author of the article admitted to me that they knew that I was specifically referring to IPS and not to Indianapolis, the organization's editors declined to update the article. Which brings me to this letter.

ICSB will continue to accept and review charter applications for schools proposing to locate within any school corporation within the Consolidated City, including Indianapolis Public Schools and MSD Washington Township, using many factors, including whether existing public schools are already providing high-quality educational opportunities for all students at the school's proposed location. To be clear, ICSB is not the authorizer of the Girls in STEM Academy and thus has no reason to be directly involved in this matter. However, as we have been drawn unwillingly into the debate, let me just say that academic data suggests there are areas within the City of Indianapolis, including in MSD Washington Township, with significant and persistent



educational attainment disparities among different groups of students who may be better served by additional high-quality public-school options.

For the record, I believe that Paramount Schools of Excellence and the Girls in STEM Academy would be an asset to the community and I support their zoning petition.
